MMA Junior High General School Supply List 2016-17

To be in the Possession of the Student:

- Students are expected to bring their own Pencil, Eraser and Pen to class
- Backpack
- Composition Book for English
- 5 subject spiral bound notebook for English
- 2 packages of Lined Notebook Paper
- Composition Book for Utah Studies (7th & 8th grade) or Geography (9th grade)
- Composition Book for Peer Mentor (applies only to those in Peer Mentor)
- Box of Colored Pencils
- 2 packages of Notebook Dividers (dividers with pockets have been popular with the students) or 16+ Adhesive Divider Tabs
- 1 package of Page Protectors
- Mess Kit for outings and special in-school activities (This does not need to be a camping kit. It can simply be a collection of a plate, fork, spoon, cup, and bowl). This will be kept at home until needed
- Water Bottle labelled with the student's full name (we do not have drinking fountains, however, there are sinks in the portable classrooms)

Please note that students will need two 3-ringed binders. One binder, a 2-3 inch binder, will be their daily binder which will have dividers for each of their classes. The second binder will be for their portfolio, a 3-4 inch binder. Many students have these from previous years so it is not necessary to provide these. We did not include these binders on the supply list due to a donation of 3-ringed binder. However, if you student wants a specific size or color they are more than welcome to provide their own.
