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To further study the countries of South America, you will create a "Portfolio" for study of information on the different countries. The portfolio may be completed alone or in small groups; however, each person will be graded individually and must put together their own portfolio. The portfolio will include four parts: (1) A Graphic Organizer of information about all of the countries in Central & South America. (2) A Country Profile concentrating on a single country. (3) A two-page research paper comparing and contrasting patterns of migration and economic development of two countries. (4) A series of 5 special use maps of Central or South America.

Resources: textbook, encyclopedias, almanacs, on-line resources, and other books from library.

Components of Country Profile Display:

- 1. People Create a circle graph for the following sets of data:
 - a. Ethnic groups / nationalities / indigenous people
 - b. Languages / Religions which ones; how many (%) for

each

- 2. Culture Create a display showing life in this country including:
 - a. Holidays / Religious Practices.... Family / Customs
 - b. Clothing / Food.... Arts / Crafts / Music / Theater etc.
 - c. Education / schools ... Recreation / sports
 - **3. Economy -** Design Tables and *Graphs* showing Economic Data including:
 - a. Standard of living: GDP (Gross Domestic Product) & per capita
 - b. International Trade: imports / exports
 - c. Currency type and value to American \$
- 4. History Make a time line of important events including:
 - a. Early people & civilizations; indigenous people
 - b. Explorers / Conquerors / Settlers: When and who?
 - c. Immigration / Emigration patterns -- Who has come? Who has gone?
 - d. Independence? When and from whom; Revolutionary leader?
 - e. Wars / conflicts, and other significant events
- 5. Government / Current Events or issues Display a flag of the country and other media to show: a.

- b. Leaders positions and names
- c. Important domestic issues / Issues with other countries
