January	Book Report	A presentation on a book read by themselves or with the help of an adult. Students will pick from a list of ways to present the book.	January 23 – February 3
February	President Bio	Students will be assigned a president of the U.S. to do a picture biography about. Presidents will be assigned randomly.	February 20 – March 3
March	Mini Science Fair	Students will pick a scientific subject that interests them and use the Scientific Method to create a project to present at the science fair.	March 27 – 30; to be presented for school on the 30 th
April	Cultural	A picture presentation about something students have learned about in cultural during the past year. It can be anything from the animals learned in zoology to a type of weather learned in geography.	April 24 – May 5
