## Rubric and Expectations- 8 week project

## (Home & School project)

## Week 1 (March 7-11)

- (5 pts) <u>Subject</u>- choose ¾ subjects to present and demonstrate to peer mentors (history, geography, botany, zoology)
- (20 pts due Monday) (HOME) <u>Topics for each chosen subject</u>- what is your topic/ main focus for each
  - (example: botany- flowers and their adaptations in Europe, history- timeline of 5 major events from World War II Germany (Europe), geography- making a 3D map (topographical) of the rivers/ mountains of S. America, botany/ geography/ zoology- a map of climatic zones and plants/ animals existing within the climatic zones, zoology- 3 animals with this continent and their importance within the habitat and the food chain/ web (think about the wolves)
  - A total of 3 lessons
- (5 pts- due Friday) Schedule- what day and times will you be presenting (10-20 minute lessons)

#### Week 2 (March 14-17)

- (5 pts) Research/ bibliography 2 resources
- (5 pts) Proposal to demonstrate for lesson 1/ peer mentor prompt questions
  - (power point, story- telling, puppet show, coloring project, Mobile, Virtual tour, Travel Brochure, Play, Creative Writing- song, poetry, game, etc.)

#### Week 3 (March 28-April 1)

- (10 pts) Give Lesson 1 to peer mentors (10-20 minutes)
- (5 pts) Research/ bibliography 2 resources
- (5 pts) Proposal to demonstrate for lesson 1/ peer mentor prompt questions
  - (power point, story- telling, puppet show, coloring project, Mobile, Virtual tour, Travel Brochure, Play, Creative Writing- song, poetry, game, etc.)

- (10 pts) Give Lesson 2 to peer mentors (10-20 minutes)
- (5 pts) Research/ bibliography 2 resources
- (5 pts) Proposal to demonstrate for lesson 1/ peer mentor prompt questions

## Week 6 (May 11-15)- Final Project/ Presentation to class- Make Your Own PEN PAL

Objective: Students will learn about a city and country/ state from somewhere in the world by creating a fictitious character from that place. Through creating a pen pal they will learn about the customs, clothing, pass times, sports, food, native names, local geography, flora, fauna and history.

## 1. (30 pts.)

Create a fictitious character from that place. Use the research to create a cardstock person on a Popsicle stick that is a small representation of the pen pal. This will also include a biography of that person written up with proper form, handwriting and mechanics. The biography will include the following details.

- a. A native name for the pen pal.
- b. The pen pal must be wearing clothes custom to that area.
- c. Their favorite sport, food and hobbies
- d. A sketch of her daily activities and responsibilities
- e. Anything else the student wants to add such as pets, vacation spots, worries, accomplishments, etc.
- f. Geographical description of where they live

#### 2. (30 pts.)

Students take their pen pals and write a fictitious letter from the pen pal to the student. The pen pal will tell the student about his/her home, her surroundings, about her school, his life details and so forth. The requirements are the following: proper letter format, at least one landform mentioned, one plant and one animal mentioned, as well as details of the home that would be particular to the area.

#### 3. (30 pts)

Students write a narrative about how the pen pal had to endure a natural disaster in his/her area. The natural disaster must be possible in his/her city and country. The student must have an adjective with every noun. There must be plot with a conflict between man and man, man and nature and man and self.
