Living Museum:

The purpose of the museum is to help students identify with historical and literary figures by researching their life, style of dress and accomplishments. We will also use the museum to raise money for "Pennies for Peace" a foundation for schools in rural Afghanistan. It will also be lots of fun!!

Student Responsibilities:

- 1) Choose a literary or historical figure (can also still be alive) who inspires you. Discuss your choice with your advisor to be sure it meets the guidelines.
- 2) Prepare a 3-paragraph written summary about the person. Paragraph 1) Where they lived, how they lived, (rich or poor, family life, schooling, rural or city)

Paragraph 2) What are their special accomplishments or talents.

Paragraph 3) How their work inspires you.

Turn the summary in to your advisory teacher by Thursday, Oct 22th at 3pm

- 3) Create a costume that is appropriate for school. Take a picture of yourself in the costume and either print it or email it to your house teacher for approval by 3pm on Thursday, Oct 22nd.
- 4) Prepare a five-sentence summary that you will "say" when a person puts a coin in your can. (Practice this a few times, to be sure you can be "in character")
- 4) The "museum" will be open on Friday, October 23rd from 2pm to 2:45 for the elementary students and parents. The coins you collect will go to Pennies for Peace, a foundation that creates schools in communities in Afghanistan.
