Letter from the Curriculum Specialist:

Have you ever wondered what it takes to become a public Montessori teacher?

Those who choose to become Montessori teachers do so with a great responsibility. The amount of time spent acquiring a Montessori training certificate is substantial. In order to be considered for a Montessori education program, a person must possess a Bachelor degree from an accredited institution. They must submit letters of recommendation along with a personal narrative about their desire to become a Montessori certified teacher and be screened through an interview process.

The accepted candidate must then attend an intensive program focusing on the educational philosophy of Dr. Maria Montessori along with concentrated instruction in the use of the Montessori materials. This training is equivalent to graduate credit hours and can be used toward obtaining a Master Degree through a number of reputable universities. Teachers are responsible for classroom observations, lesson plans, in-depth reading, literature reviews, research papers and an internship. Teacher candidates must then pass a written and oral exam proctored by an experienced and certified Montessorian. While the amount of time spent in a teacher-training program varies, a typical program takes two to three years to complete.

MACTE (Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education), recognized by the US Department of Education is dedicated to assuring that Montessori education is a rich and supported pedagogy. Most Montessori teachers do not come to education as a first career. They are inspired by the experiences of their own children and driven to increase their impact on the world through becoming Montessori guides. Those who desire to enter the teaching career without a traditional education degree must take a number of methodology and content courses and pass the state mandated standardized test, as well as receive approval from the state and their employer, prior to receiving a teaching license; all in addition to the Montessori training.

Montessori education is spreading throughout the nation as a viable, valuable and meaningful education for children. There are currently over 112,000 students attending 450-public Montessori programs in the United States. The National Center for Montessori in the Public Sector, along with a number of other organizations supports the growing population of public Montessori Schools and teachers. There are currently 6 Montessori charter schools in the state of Utah, all which operates under state educational sanctions and Montessori authorizations.
