## **Job Shadowing Presentation Requirements and Expectations**

Assignment: Congratulations taking your first step to securing a job shadow experience. Work closely with your parents to secure a situation you all feel comfortable with, and safe. Communicate clearly the date, time, and appropriate attire. The next step will then be to think about what questions you have and what information you wish to obtain during your experience. After your experience you need to think of a way to share this information with your fellow students by a simple oral presentation, PowerPoint presentation, or table top display. If a student is unable to participate, they can select a job of interest and do the research in preparation to a presentation or display.

## **Requirements:**

Each presentation should be 3-5 minutes. Table top presentations should have labeled objects/pictures. Here are some points to consider including;

NEVER disrespect or badmouth a former employer or someone who helped you professionally. It makes you look silly, immature, and very unprofessional. Also, you never know when that person may appear in your professional circle again.
