Maria Montessori Academy Geocaching Field Experience on October 26, 2016

Our College and Career Awareness classes will be taking a *local* Geocaching trip on October 26, 2016 during your students' respective College and Career Awareness class. We will be walking to geocaches located within a mile of the school.

What you will do and what you will learn

- Introduce students to a lifelong sport
- Utilize mobile devices and GPS receivers to communicate with satellites to disclose the location of hidden treasures around the school.
- Students will learn how a satellite communicates a precise location on the globe
- Geocaching techniques will be implemented to locate 4-5 caches surrounding the school within a mile.
- Recognize the use of information technology systems in all facets of society
- Explore different types of networks
- If you take something from a cache, you are expected to replace it with something else. These items are inexpensive such as pencils, small toys, key chains, etc.

What you will need to wear or bring

- Hat/Sunglasses
- Good walking shoes
- Please dress in layers
- Even if it rains, we are going, so be prepared with appropriate gear (unless there is lightning)
- Mobile device preloaded with the app Geocaching by Groundspeak, Inc.

Note: I also will have 4 GPS receivers pre-loaded with the coordinates for students to use
