Course Description:

Geography is described as the study of the "why of the where." This class will explore how to use geography as a tool to better understand the world in which we live. Students will learn to evaluate and question the why and where of spatial perceptions that are read, seen, and heard. The six standards identified below are best understood when using the following geographic themes: location, place, movement, region, and human-environmental interaction.

Our class topics will fit within the cycle theme of study:

Orientation- Aug. 17-Sept. 4

Exploration- Sept. 7- Oct. 23

Identity- Oct. 24- Jan. 15

Systems- Jan. 16- Mar. 18

Interdependence- Mar. 19- May 26

Course Expectations:

Students will need to be prepared to work each class period (have their writing utensils with them, follow directions, and keep their notebooks and planners within reach). Students will also be expected to use speaking, listening, reading and writing skills in this course. If assignments and projects cannot be turned in on the due dates listed, you must talk with the teacher about an extension.
