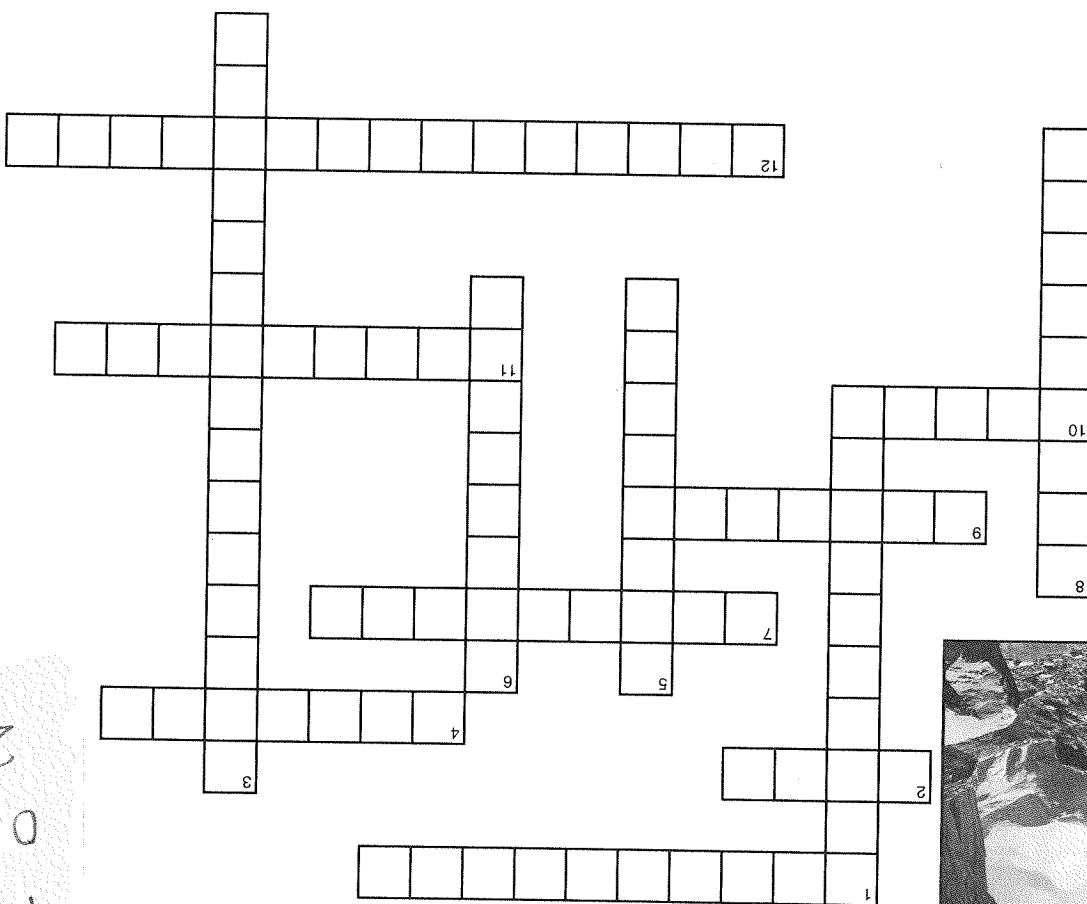
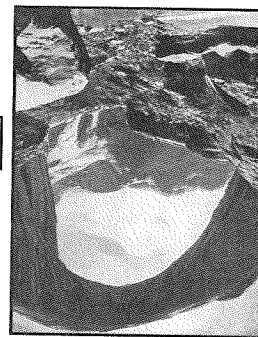


Complete the crossword puzzle using the Words to Understand from Chapter 1.
