

#### **Overview**

We will end this cycle by focusing on the early mountain men, trappers and traders of Utah. You will read excerpts of their journals to determine where they were exploring on a map. You will also get to watch a movie about the one of the most notorious explorer parties that made their way through the Utah wilderness: the Donner Party. Along the way we will learn mountain man lingo and try to use it in our everyday speech. The Utah County of the Week scavenger hunt is back with the focus on Utah and Sanpete counties. Finally, you will be able to start your final project for this cycle: My Utah Album and an essay on Utah Compose in which you describe how natural forces shape the landscape here in Utah.

**7th graders** will also begin their **Utah History Day** research, which will require them to gather 15 photos and cite them on Easy Bib through their Google accounts. Check the tab on the class blog for resources.
