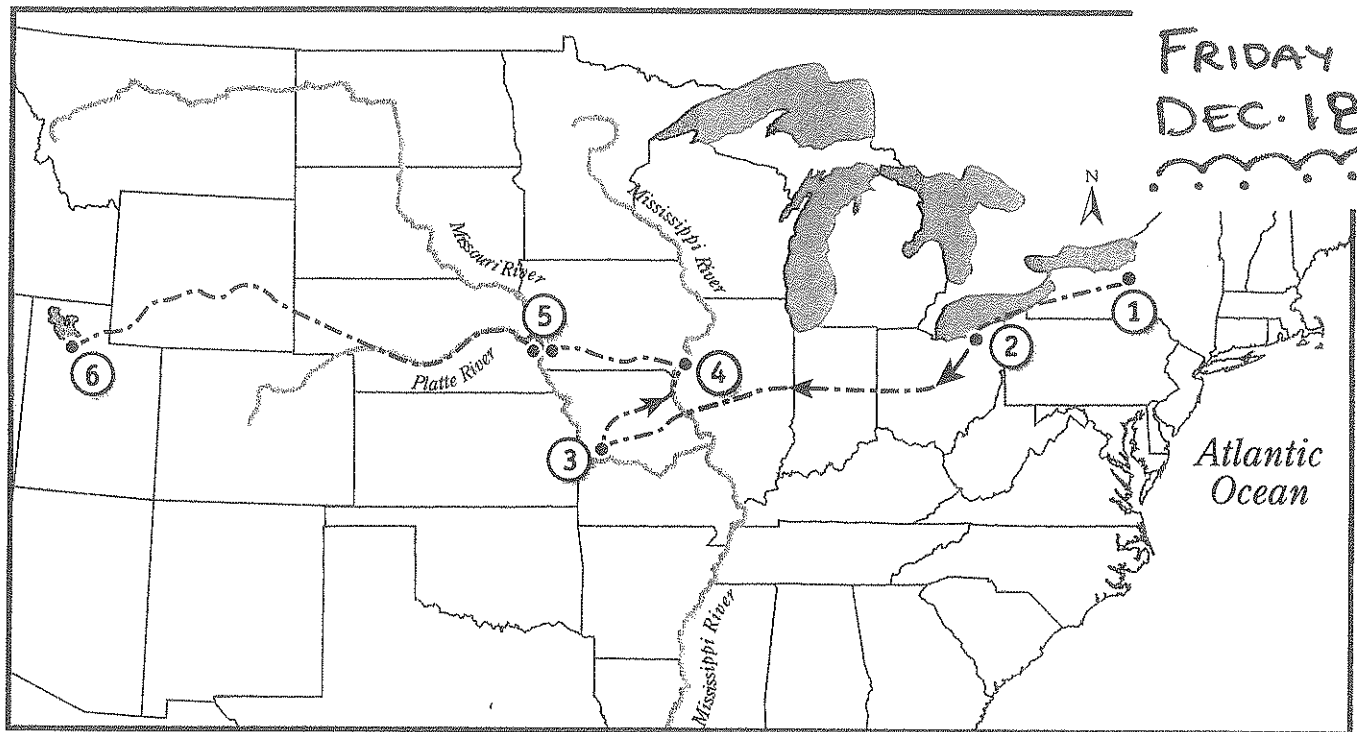


Sequence the movement of the Mormons from New York to the Salt Lake Valley. Number the events in the order they occurred and as they correspond to the numbers on the map.

- _____ On July 24, 1847, the first Mormons entered the Salt Lake Valley.
- _____ Joseph Smith organized the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Palmyra, New York.

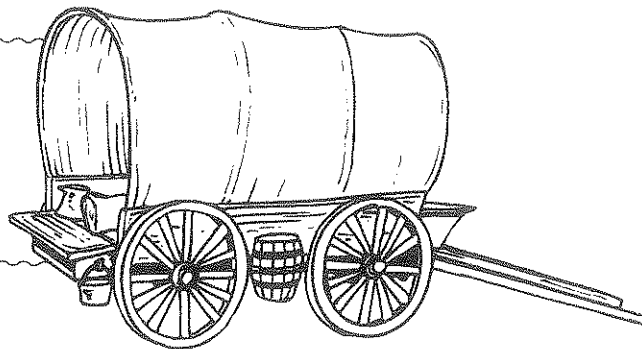

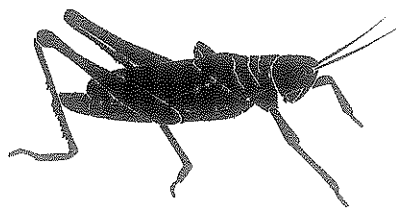



Their daily activities were held outdoors or at home.		
"The intruders carried deadly childhood diseases . . ."		
They suffered when the supply of wild animals they needed for food decreased.		
Before coming to Utah, women had organized the female Relief Society.		
Causes of conflict usually involved territorial rights and retaliation for aggressive acts.		
One woman cooked a meal of venison, beans, and ground sunflower seeds, and insisted on sharing with others.		
By 1860, they were living in over 100 new towns.		
They started building forts in case they needed to move into them for protection.
