
## Yearbook Study Guide Cycle 1

1 September - 10 September



**Overview:** This cycle we will explore the qualities that make a successful yearbook and literary magazine, and begin applying this knowledge by making covers and other pages for the yearbook and literary magazine #1.

Essential Questions: How is a literary magazine different from a yearbook? What are significant moments that students (K-9) will want to remember? What makes an effective advertising campaign? How can pictures and words work together to reflect a theme?

## Checklist:

1. Suggest at least 1 idea for the yearbook theme. Working with the class, choose the yearbook theme for the 2015-16 school year.
2. Suggest at least 1 idea for literary magazine #1. Working with the class, choose the theme for literary magazine #1.
3. Suggest at least 1 event, notable person, club, etc. that should be featured in the yearbook. Working with the class, create a list of all events, people to interview, clubs, or other ideas to be included in the yearbook.
4· Working with the class, create the specifications for literary magazine submissions· Design a rubric for evaluating which submissions get published·
5. Demonstrate understanding of a variety of types of photography (long shot, portrait, close up, extreme close up, landscape, action). Using a digital camera, take a variety of photos for each category.
