Essential Questions:

What is my aesthetic?

What makes me feel alive?

How does my life and experiences affect my art?

- Students will create meaning in works of art.
- Students will explore the story of their aesthetic.
- Students will interpret conceptual works of art.

Art 101 (required):

- Visual Essay
 - Use the National Geographics magazine to create a visual essay of your aesthetic

Projects (Choose 1):

- Scratch Art
 - Colored crayons, black crayon, white paper, scratch material (ie. coin or toothpick)
 - First, thickly color an entire page with colored crayon
 - Next, thickly color with black crayon overtop of the color
 - Finally, with your visual essay as a point of inspiration, scratch an image out
 - Extension: Use words for either layer
- Mixed Media
 - Paint, Charcoal, Oil Pastel, Colored Pencil, Marker, Pencil, or Collage
 - Choose an element of your visual essay aesthetic to focus on
 - Combine 2 or more materials to create a work of art based on your aesthetic
 - Write a 3 sentence artist statement
 - Extension: In your artist statement, describe the type of balance you used

Terms:

Aesthetic: in art, relating to one's perspective of beauty and creativity

Anaesthetic: a drug used to numb or deaden; to put to sleep
