These questions need to be answered in a 1 paragraph response EACH.

American Indian Nations Requirements:

Who were they? (Famous Native American, what were they called)

Where did they live in the United States? (what state or region)

What languages did they speak? (provide examples)

What beliefs did they have? (provide examples)

What traditions did they have? (provide examples)

What were their lifestyle? (food, dress, weapons, homes, etc.)

Are they still living in the United States? If not explain why.
