




Land from East:

Louisiana Purchase: Background



- France explored around the Mississippi River and was one of the most dominant European powers in the U.S.
- During the French and Indian War in 1792, France gave Louisiana to Spain
- Spain did little colonization in that area so they signed a secret treaty with France to give that area back to France
- This stirred up tensions between the French and Americans

U.S.- France Negotiations

- France was slow at making Louisiana a great area for trading goods
- Future President James Monroe and a U.S. minister to France Robert Livingston went to France to make a deal
- France was in debt and Napoleon Bonaparte sold the area to the U.S. for around \$15 million= \$18 a square mile
