MMA Junior High General School Supply List 2016-17

To be in the Possession of the Student:

- Students are expected to bring their own **Pencil**, **Eraser and Pen** to class
- Backpack
- Composition Book (not a spiral notebook) for Math
- Composition Book for Utah Studies (7th & 8th grade) or Geography (9th grade)
- Composition Book for Peer Mentor (applies only to those in Peer Mentor)
- Composition Book for Erdkinder (applies only to those in Erdkinder)

- 2 packages of Notebook Dividers (dividers with pockets have been popular with the students) or 16+ Adhesive Divider Tabs.
